SASEG Student Grants

General Conditions

1. The SASEG Student Grant, established in summer 2017, is designated for MSc and PhD students of Earth Sciences of Swiss Universities working on geo-energy topics including conventional and unconventional hydrocarbons, geothermal energy, geological storage of carbon dioxide and natural gas, nuclear waste repositories and other geo- energy matters.
2. The SASEG Student Grant is aimed at participating in the costs of data acquisition and analysis, and in fees and travel costs for participation at relevant conferences and courses.
3. The SASEG Student Grant does not cover costs associated with purchase of software and other IT equipment.
4. The SASEG Student Grant will be awarded to deserving students demonstrating a relevant and sound research program supported by financial justification.
5. Grant applications are made by filling in the SASEG Student Grant application form and attaching a motivation letter, a short CV and a letter of support from the research supervisor.
6. The number of SASEG Student Grants awarded each year will depend on SASEG's overall financial results of the previous (calendar) year.
7. A SASEG Grant Scoring Committee formed by members of the SASEG Executive Committee will identify the SASEG Student Grant recipients.
8. The decision of the SASEG Grant Scoring Committee will be communicated to the applicants by email.
9. Within two months of the receipt of data acquisition and analyses or of returning from the attended conference or course, respectively, individual SASEG Student Grant recipients are requested to send a 2-pages report to the SASEG Grant Scoring Committee (student@saseg.ch) summarizing the results achieved by using the SASEG Student Grant, together with a financial justification (copy of receipts). By failing to do so, future applications of the same institute and/or research organisation will not be considered for the two following years.
